

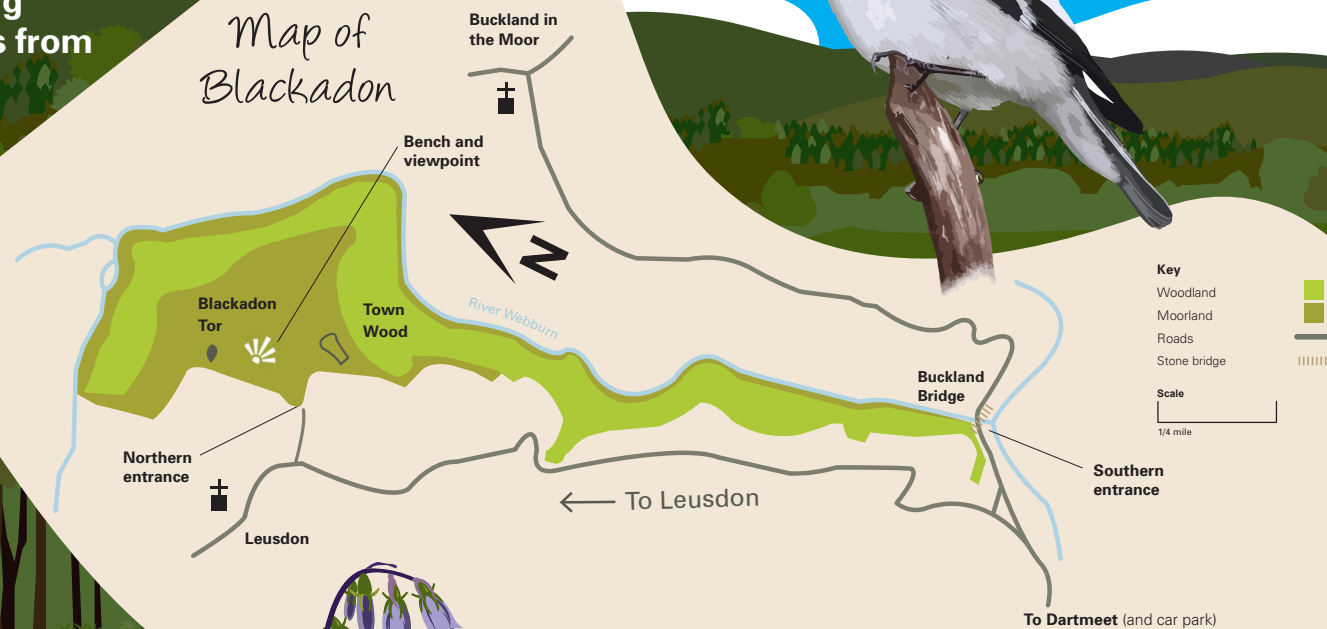


# Devon Wildlife Trust

## Wildlife to watch for

On cold winter days parties of redwings gorge themselves on the ripe berries of rowan trees which are scattered across the hillside of Blackadon Tor.

As the weather warms the turf around these rowans turns purple as thousands of bluebells come into bloom, while in the woodlands below pied flycatchers return from Africa to raise a family in the nestboxes we provide for them.

## How to find Blackadon nature reserve

Blackadon is near the village of Buckland-in-the-Moor. Take the road from Ashburton towards Dartmeet. Pass River Dart Country Park before reaching Newbridge. Soon after its narrow bridge, take right turn to Buckland-in-the-Moor. Follow River Dart for more than 1/2 mile until reaching Buckland Bridge. Southern entrance to reserve is on left. Parking is very limited. Use Ordnance Survey Explorer Map 28 Dartmoor. Southern entrance is at map ref SX 718 719.
