

## Southern damselfly

Springs which bubble up in Devon's wet heathlands are crucial for one of our rarest damselflies. This insect declined by 30% from 1960 to 2000 and seemed to have been lost from DWT's Venn Ottery nature reserve in east Devon, So, we did two things; first, we ensured the heathland and freshwater habitats were in perfect condition for the southern damselfly's two-year life cycle. And then we re-introduced a population from a site in Hampshire. Ten years and several successful generations on, the southern damselfly is thriving in this Otter valley nature reserve once more. But we need to continue the management of the site to ensure the streams are unshaded (for successful egg-laying) and there is abundant tussocky vegetation nearby for mating and feeding.
